# **Piano Universe** 2022/2023 Studio Policy

## TUITION

## Cost:

- 1. \$490 per semester for 30 minute weekly lessons
- 2. \$700 per semester for 45 minute weekly lessons
- 3. \$910 per semester for 60 minute weekly lessons

## Conditions:

- 1. Semesters include 14 lessons over a 16 week period.
- 2. Tuition must be paid in full before the first day of the semester.
  - Alternate payment plan option: 4 equal payments every 4 weeks, via auto-pay.
- 3. If a student quits mid-semester, no refunds are given, and auto-pay continues until semester tuition is paid in full.

**Lesson times:** Lesson times are decided before the semester begins. After that, lesson times are locked in place for the entire semester.

## Missed lessons:

- 1. When a student misses, they can request a recorded video lesson or 1 make-up credit. Make-up credits can be used to attend 1 "Power Week" class. Credits do not roll over into the next semester.
- 2. When the teacher misses, no make-up is given. Tuition accounts for 2 teacher absences per semester. Unused teacher absences are used at the end of each semester.
- 3. If the student is sick, but still wants a lesson, they can request an online or video lesson.

**Power Week:** After each semester, 5 days of group classes begin, filled with fun activities, concept reinforcement, and recital preparation. Each class costs 1 make-up credit or \$45, due before attending. Power Week is not included with tuition.

# **PARENT EXPECTATIONS** (Adult students, some of this applies to you, too!)

For K-12 students, much of their success depends on parental involvement. Here are some ways to help:

- 1. Provide an *appropriate instrument*. Concert pianists excel with 88-key acoustic pianos. Producers can excel with 61-key MIDI keyboards. Maintain the instrument, too.
- 2. Provide *materials* to help with practicing and studying, including:
  - **Metronome:** This magical musical clinical-strength Band-Aid makes amateur musicians into master musicians. It is not fun, but it is extremely effective.
  - **Hard copies of music:** Most photocopying is illegal, and hard copies of books are motivational. Support the music industry!
  - **Three-ring binder/sheet protectors:** If photocopies are necessary, this keeps materials organized, undestroyed, and not lost.
  - **Apps and Software:** Fun programs exist for numerous musical concepts. Ask the teacher for suggestions if you're not sure what to get.
  - **Low-tech Games:** Not a smartphone fan? Music stores have board games, flashcards, toys and more to help reinforce musical concepts.
  - Internet access: Studio website, theory/listening skills websites, YouTube, and more can enhance variety, efficiency, and effectiveness of practice time.
- 3. Set up a *productive learning environment*. Remove distractions near the piano, like food, clutter, dust/dirt, bad lighting, pets, loud noises, etc.
- 4. Set a *practice schedule*. Add practicing to daily chores and set a regular time of day.
- 5. Read the student's *practice assignments*.
- 6. Sit with them at home and in lessons sometimes, and *learn with them.*
- 7. Make them *perform for you*.
- 8. *Read studio emails carefully* for upcoming events and opportunities.
- 9. Motivate through *positive reinforcement, constructive criticism,* and *genuine interest*.
- 10. Communicate *concerns* to the teacher about practicing and progress.
- 11. Be *consistent* with attendance.
- 12. Work with me. We're on the same team!

## **STUDENT EXPECTATIONS**

#### General:

- 1. *Practice* daily and thoughtfully. Most progress happens at home, not in the lesson.
- 2. Be **on time** and **prepared**. Save time by having books out, pages ready, etc. If late or unprepared, minutes lost do not count towards make-up credits.
- 3. Use *resources*: Apps, websites, books, and more should be available to practice concepts outside of lessons. Use lesson time to learn new concepts, not to review old ones.
- 4. Be *creative*, and take *initiative*. Don't wait to be told to do something. Be an explorer, bring new questions every week, read new things every day, etc.

## Lesson Etiquette:

- 1. Behave as in a classroom setting, *i.e.* no temper tantrums, rude attitude, destruction of property, etc.
- 2. No physical contact allowed.

## **Recital Etiquette:**

- 1. Arrive 15 minutes early, so the recital can start on time.
- 2. Stay for the entire recital; support your peers.
- 3. Dress accordingly; read studio emails carefully for these kinds of details.
- 4. Play what is planned. Ask beforehand about changes/additions.
- 5. Get rid of distractions, *i.e.* silence phones, turn off flash/shutter sounds on camera, etc.
- 6. Adhere to all guidelines of the performance venue.

**Equipment:** Any equipment damaged must be paid for by the student or the student's parent or legal guardian.

**Recordings/Photography:** Students may be filmed or photographed for blog posts, advertising, presentations, or other professional material. Students can opt. out by asking their teacher.
